

### Goal 1 Key Performance Outcome School Climate SY 2017-18

#### **About the School Climate Measure:**

As documented in the District Accountability System's Reporting, Evaluating, & Monitoring Instrument (DAS-REMI), a Key Performance Outcome for Goal I is to improve school climate. School climate refers to the quality, character, and culture of a school, and is a factor that research studies have documented as a positive factor impacting student achievement.

The GADOE climate rating system currently includes school-level data within four climate domains: (1) School Climate Surveys (2) Student Discipline (3) Safe and Substance-Free Learning Environment and (4) School Wide Attendance.

- 1. The School Climate Survey domain includes data from the Georgia Student Health Survey II (GSHS II), Georgia School Personnel Survey (GSPS), and Georgia Parent Survey (GPS). Student and staff participation rates are calculated based on the October FTE count and Certified/Classified Personnel Information (CPI).
- 2. The Student Discipline domain is derived from discipline data reported in Student Record. The calculation is based on the number of ISS, OSS, expulsion and alternative school assignments divided by the total number of students enrolled at the school as reported in FTE.
- 3. The Safe & Substance-Free Learning Environment domain includes data collected through Student Record involving incidents related to violence, drugs, bullying and harassment. This domain also includes 18 survey item responses from GSHS II pertaining to substance abuse, bullying, harassment, and violent incidents.
- 4. The School Wide Attendance domain includes student attendance data from Student Record and administrator, staff, and teacher attendance data from CPI.

The overall climate score is based on the average of the School Climate Surveys, Student Discipline, Safe and Substance-Free Learning Environment, and School Wide Attendance domain scores. Schools also earn five bonus points toward the overall climate score if their PBIS implementation is approved by the GADOE PBIS Team. The overall score is then converted to a star rating using the rubric below.

The district target is to improve the percentage of schools earning a School Climate Star Rating of 3 or higher from the SY 2016-17 baseline of 82% to 85% or higher by SY 2021-22.



#### **Key Points:**

- Seventy-three percent (73%) of schools earned a climate star rating of 3 or higher. Across the state, 92% of schools were rated 3 or higher, and 83% of the comparison group earned 3 or more stars.
- The percentage of schools with 3 or more stars declined by 8 points compared to last year, however, the SY 2017-18 rate remained 9 points higher than in SY 2015-16.
- Schools that achieved a 5 star climate rating include STEM, Savannah Arts, Oglethorpe, and, for the third consecutive year, Early College.
- Twenty-five schools improved their overall climate score. Eleven of these sites also raised their climate star rating, including Garden City, the School of Humanities at Juliette Low, Shuman, Myers, STEM, Groves, Johnson, New Hampstead, Savannah Arts, Oglethorpe, and Savannah Classical.
- Gadsden Elementary had the greatest decline in overall climate score and fell from a 5 star to a 1 star rating. The Discipline domain had the greatest impact on the school's overall score. A rise in the school's weighted suspension rate resulted in a decrease of over 60 points in the Discipline climate domain. The rise in the school's weighted suspension rate was due to the changes in administrative procedures that were implemented in SY 2017-18.





Figure 3. Median Overall Climate Score: by Level






Figure 4. Median Climate Score: by Domain and Level
