Local internet providers offering low cost or free internet plans

As schools are transitioning to virtual learning, many internet service providers are taking steps to provide all families with access to the Internet at home. While there are public computers at some locations throughout the county, we recognize that transportation may be a barrier. Allconnect

Access by AT&T

AT&T provides a low-cost wireless home internet plan for households with at least one person who receives SNAP or SSI benefits. Plans start at \$9.95/month. Visit att.com or call 855-220-5211.

Everyone.org is a national nonprofit working to eliminate the digital divide by making high speed, low cost internet service and computers, and free digital literacy courses accessible to all unconnected Americans. Devices are refurbished so individuals and families can purchase discounted devices, including laptops and tablets. Comcast

Comcast is offering their Internet Essentials service free for two months (regularly \$9.95/month +tax)

You may qualify if you are eligible for public assistance programs like the National School Lunch Program, housing assistance, Medicaid, SNAP, SSI, and have not subscribed to Comcast Internet within the last 90 days. PCs for People

PCs for People is a nonprofit organization that refurbishes desktop and laptop computers for distribution to eligible recipients. PCs for People also offers high speed internet for \$11.25/month for qualified households. Visit <https://www.pcsforpeople.org/> to learn if you are eligible.

Spectrum

Spectrum Internet Assist provides affordable high-speed internet connection to low-income families, students, and seniors. Spectrum will offer internet and Wi-Fi services for K-12 and college students affected by the current school closures, in households not already subscribed to Spectrum Internet.
