

Goals for Student Achievement

Bloomingtondale Elementary School Goals:

- The percentage of Bloomingtondale Bears in grades K-5 scoring on or above grade level (green), will increase from 47% to 52% as measured by the Reading iReady Diagnostic by End of Year administration in Spring 2023.
- From EOY 2022 to EOY 2023, the percentage of students scoring on or above grade level ("green") in Math on the i-Ready Diagnostic will increase from 41% to 44%.
- The percentage of Bloomingtondale Bears in grades K-5 scoring on or above grade level (green), will increase from 41% to 46% as measured by the Math iReady Diagnostic by End of Year administration in Spring 2023.

Teachers, Parents, and Students -Together for Success

Teachers will provide...

- Copies of multiplication/division facts and computer programs that support memorization of basic facts
- Make sure students have an opportunity to select reading materials on their independent reading level to take home.
- Directions on using evidence from text to help students write a constructed response.

Parents/Families will provide...

- Assist my child with memorizing and writing multiplication and division facts.
- Provide a time for my child to read nightly and sign their log.
- Review my child's writing using the teacher supplied directions and listen to my child read aloud their written responses.

Students will...

- Nightly Practice memorizing and writing multiplication and division facts.
- Read each night for at least 20 minutes and record on a log.
- Write in complete sentences for constructed and extended responses.

What is a School-Parent Compact?

A school-parent compact is a written agreement between teachers and parents. It is a document that clarifies the school- parent relationship in order to reach high academic achievement for all students. This school-parent compact was solely designed to reflect the needs of your fourth-grade child. We will use the compact in parent conferences and we will also use it in the classroom. It is grade specific and will only impact your child at the grade he/she is in for the 2022-2023 school year.

Partnerships
